Host your next business meeting or luncheon in our Private Dining Room. High Speed Wireless Internet is available for e-mailing, transmitting presentations, or corporate communications.

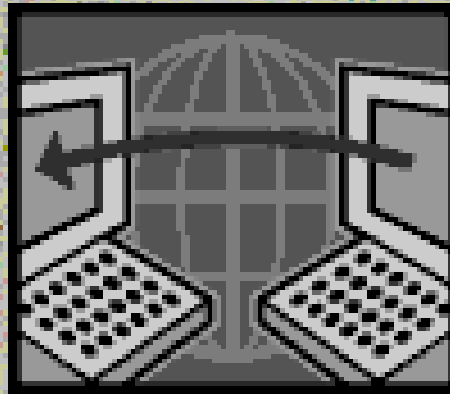

The "How-To" of Wi-Fi.

Before you Connect, to LFCCLink™ you should know the following:

- There is no access charge for member use in the 19th Hole restaurant.
- By accessing LFCCLink you are agreeing with the Terms of Use Agreement*.
- You must be at least 18 years old or with a parent to use this service.
- The SSID or network name is "LFCCLink".
- LFCCLink does not use or require encryption security so you should disable this feature.
- Users of LFCCLink should use their own firewall, antivirus software and security measures.
- Wireless connections are handled via an "Infrastructure" mode, Ad-Hoc mode will not work.
- LFCCLink supports wireless protocols 802b and 802g.
- You must enable your wireless network card to use or accept dynamic IP addresses or DHCP.
- Windows XP has multiple ways to connect to a wireless network.

Getting Started (First time use)

Windows XP: - Standard Start Menu

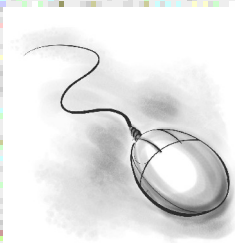
1. Click START, CONTROL PANEL, double click NETWORK CONNECTIONS, right click WIRELESS NETWORK CONNECTION icon & select "Properties"
2. Select Internet Protocol from the list and then click PROPERTIES. Make sure the buttons "Obtain an IP address automatically" and "Obtain DNS server address automatically" are checked, then hit OK. Your Computer may restart.
3. Click WIRELESS NETWORKS tab and

check the box "Use Windows to configure my wireless network settings". If LFCCLink is not listed in the Preferred Networks list, then click ADD, enter LFCCLink for the SSID name, select OPEN in Network Authentication, and "Disabled" in the Data Encryption box, then OK.

4. Click VIEW WIRELESS NETWORK, select LFCCLink from the list and click CONNECT in the bottom right of screen.

6. Your wireless card should now attempt to connect to LFCCLink, after 10 seconds the LFCCLink should show connected. Close all windows.

7. You should now be able to open your Internet Browser and surf.



Windows 2000

1. Click on START, SETTINGS, NETWORK & DIAL UP CONNECTIONS.
2. Select your 802b or g WLAN adapter
3. Click on PROPERTIES in the 802 WLAN adapter status page.
4. Click on CONFIGURE and select ADVANCE tab.
5. In the SSID field, enter LFCCLink and click OK. You may have to restart your computer.

Windows 98

1. Click on START, SETTINGS, CONTROL PANEL, and then double click the NETWORK icon. Select your wireless card from the list.
2. Click on "PROPERTIES" and click the "SETTINGS" tab.
3. Enter "LFCCLink" in the WLAN service area or SSID value box. Then click "OK".
4. You may have to restart your computer.

Browser and Network Card Issues:

- Depending on how and where you use your wireless device may affect your ability to use LFCCLink. LFCCLink may require that you turn off or uncheck the use of proxy servers in Internet Explorer. These settings are found in Internet Explorer menu option "Tools" → Internet Options... → Connections Tab → LAN Settings...
- If you normally connect to the Internet using Dial-UP, go to Internet Explorer menu option "Tools" → Internet Options... → Connections Tab and select "Never Dial a Connection".

How Secure is LFCCLink:

LFCCLink Wi-Fi access is as secure as any open public access network like public telephones and dial-up Internet accounts. It's always a good idea to make sure you are on an SSL-encrypted web page prior to sending or receiving confidential data or making on-line purchases. LFCC is not liable to you for any lack of security you may experience in using the LFCCLink hotspot.

VPN:

You may need to contact your corporate VPN administrator for help regarding connecting to and using LFCCLink.
